3rd Annual Low Tide Walk

Put on your favorite Camp Fire USA shirt (or red, white and blue) and join Camp Fire kids, volunteers, their families, and staff for the 3rd Annual Carkeek-to-Golden Gardens low tide beach walk on Saturday, June 25th.

We'll meet at 1 p.m. at Carkeek Park at the kiosk near the bridge to beach. At least one adult per group is required; additional supervision will be provided by older youth and other volunteers. (We recommend dropping a car at Blue Ridge Beach or Golden Gardens for the trip back to Carkeek, but we will have shuttle vans available for both the short and full walks)

Packets of beads earned and the National Trails Day emblem will be available for purchase at the end of the walk (\$1.65 for just the emblem, or \$3 for emblem plus nine beads).

Pick-up: Short walk pick-up at approximately 3 p.m., at Blue Ridge Beach (at the intersection of NW Blue Ridge Drive and Triton Dr. NW.) Full walk pick-up at Golden Gardens Beach at approximately 4 p.m.

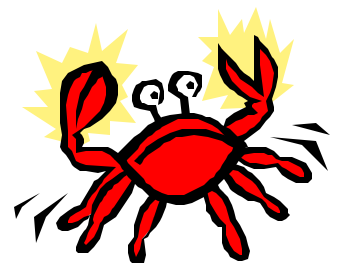
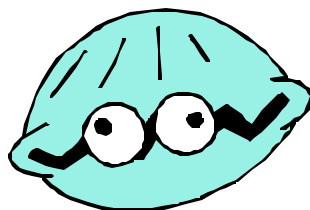
