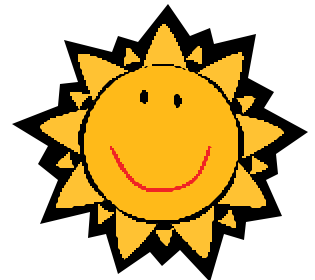

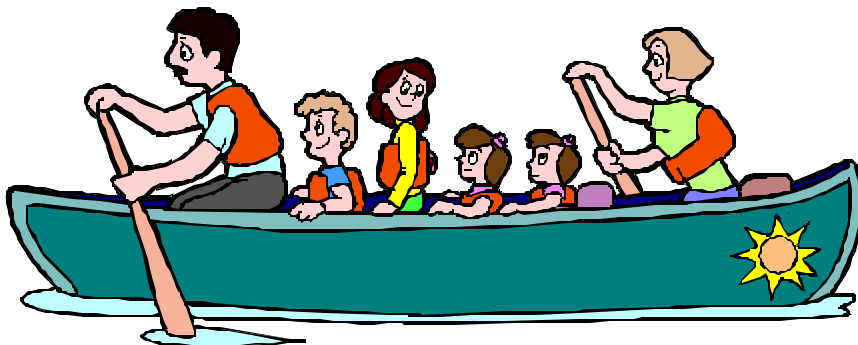
Group Camping Weekend - 2005
