So be sure to mark your calendars for the Leaders' Association Meeting dates in your area and attend these important, informative meetings.



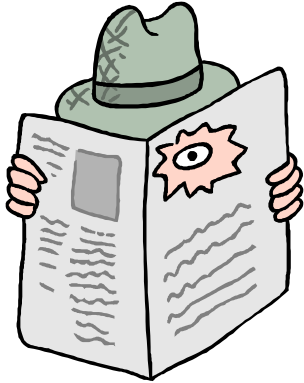
Lost and Found

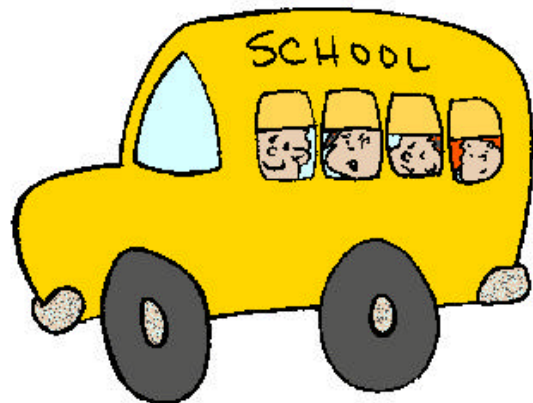
